## Renewed Direction

About one year ago, Bryan Pepper (Bedford, TX), National SCRABBLE Championship (NSC) Division 1 Leader and Official SCRABBLE Tournament Director since 1998, announced to one and all that he was going to PLAY SCRABBLE tournaments in 2011. That meant that not only were we going to have to find another Division 1 leader at this year's NSC - thanks, John Robertson (Cambridge, ON) - but that the Dallas Open and all of our local one-day events were going to need a new director.

Mary Rhoades (Bedford, TX) stepped in for this year's Dallas Open and yours truly volunteered to take over the one-day events and direct for the first time in about 23 years.

That leads to a question I get asked often: How did you first get started playing Official SCRABBLE tournaments?

I was a freshman at SMU in Dallas in 1973. A kid named Michael Griffin decided to have a SCRABBLE tournament for our dorm. We had 2 out of 3 matches. I wiped everybody out, even got to play YTTERBIA in one of the games and naively thought, "I must be good." I asked my parents for a Webster's Unabridged Dictionary for Christmas, bought a deluxe board and started lugging those two items around, playing mostly mothers of girls I went out with, former teachers and college friends.

There was a flyer in the SCRABBLE set with an ad for what was then called SCRABBLE Players. I looked at that ad off and on for 7 years before I finally got the nerve to call Mr. Jim Houle, head of the SPA, in February, 1980. I was told there was a club here in Dallas and a tournament that weekend.
"SIGN ME UP?"
I was totally hooked. I met players who were to become some of my dearest friends for 31 years.

There was a woman named Bettye Williams (she taught Geometry at my old high school - two of my little brothers had her as a teacher) who ran the club. She did so until she could no longer. I took the Director's Test and got my Director's Certificate in 1982 or 1983. Somewhere along the way, I ended up directing the club for a few years before turning it over to Michael Willis (Midlothian, TX).

We have had so many updates to the rules in that time that, even though I had a grandfathered Director's Certificate, I knew that I really needed a refresher course to be "tour-

nament ready." I read the NASPA Official Tournament Rules a time or two and took the new test. I PASSED!
Saturday, January 29, 2011 marked my reentry into directing official SCRABBLE tournaments. I absolutely loved it.
I did have help. The night before, my wife, Carla, made some player scorecards and then we had two dry runs with John Chew's tsh program. Carla came to the tournament site Saturday morning, and she and Bryan Pepper helped me get everything rolling though, like good teachers, they had me learning by doing. Bryan also brought his "crate," which contains anything a Director might want to have handy at a tournament site. I was totally impressed. Eve Engelbrite (Lewisville, TX) and Michael Early (Fort Worth, TX) were there ahead of time and helped set up tables with challenge and tally slips. Entering the data and submitting the results were a snap.
There was one director's call:
Player $A$ : "I played three letters and drew three. A fourth tile fell out of the bag facedown. I picked it up with the same hand that held the other three and now all four tiles are in my closed hand. I haven't seen any of them."

## NSC 201 I Update <br> by the Championship Committee

The Hotel InterContinental Dallas, site of the 2011 National SCRABBLE Championship (NSC), has made rooms available for group rate bookings ( $\$ 129 /$ night) well in advance of our planned late-March opening of event registration. You can follow the link from the NSC page in NASPAWiki to book your rooms now. As any tournament organizer does, we try hard to negotiate the best possible rate for players, whose hotel charges help pay for the playing space and other common hotel services. We appreciate your supporting the event by staying on site.

Between now and the end of March, the committee will be busy finishing its review of all of the 124 comment cards it received at last year's NSC, to see which of the many helpful suggestions for improvement we can implement. One of the most frequent requests was to shorten the two-hour lunch break and play eight games per day. We can't shorten the lunch break, as it's traditionally the only time when working committees can get together for face-to-face discussions. And, since $86 \%$ of players were fine with the current seven games, we are hoping to add an optional Lunch Bird event to give the remaining $14 \%$ the extra daily game they want.

## 2011 World SCRABBLE Championship Update

Organizers of the 2011 World SCRABBLE Championship (WSC) are still negotiating the details of a planned championship in Poland late this year, but whenever and wherever it takes place, the United States and Canada will be able to field strong teams as usual. Canada and the U.S. are the only countries which have won three of the ten championships to date.

NASPA members interested in qualifying for Team U.S.A. or Team Canada should be sure they are registered with the NASPA International Committee or Canadian Committee respectively, and check NASPAWiki for current standings in the qualification systems devised by those bodies.

American hopefuls (currently numbering 28) can qualify by any of the following routes: World English-language SCRABBLE Players Association (WESPA) bye (in 2009, WESPA awarded byes to the 2007 finalists and a World Youth SCRABBLE Champion), performance at WSC 2009, peak OWL or CSW tournament rating, or through a qualifying tournament. Canadian hopefuls (currently 15) can qualify by the same routes, or by winning the 2011 Canadian National SCRABBLE Championship (see elsewhere in this issue).

WSC 2009 performance places go to Americans Dave Wiegand (Portland, OR), Nathan Benedict (Tucson, AZ) and Jason Katz-Brown (Tokyo, JPN); and Canadian former World Champions David Boys (Dorval, QC) and Joel Wapnick (Montreal, QC). Good luck to all!

But, as the player commingled the four drawn tiles, it became an overdraw and the overdraw rules applied.

## FLASH 2010 Game the Year

Earlier this month at the Toy Industry Association's (TIA) Toy of the Year Awards, Hasbro's SCRABBLE FLASH, the latest addition to the SCRABBLE brand, received the prestigious Game of the Year award. In doing so, it edged out Hasbro's own SCRABBLE SLAM card game and five other nominees.

The award was announced along with eleven others on February 12th at the opening of the 108th American International Toy Fair at the Toy Center in New York City. This year, for the first time, the voting process was expanded to include not only TIA members, but retailers, journalists, bloggers and consumers. Hasbro has received at least one award in each of the past five years.

SCRABBLE FLASH consists of a set of five SmartLink letter cubes, which can display random letters but communicate their location and letters with each other, allowing one or more players to play an automatically adjudicated version of a game like Anagrams. SCRABBLE FLASH uses the OSPD4 word list.

In late 2010, NASPA was able to negotiate the resumption of Hasbro's game shipments to sanctioned tournament directors for use as prizes at their tournaments. Eligible directors have received copies of SCRABBLE FLASH, and the Bulletin has run photos of happy winners receiving their FLASH prize. ## Can-Am Challenge Update by John Chew

The teams have been finalized for next month's Can-Am SCRABBLE Challenge, and memorialized in a T-shirt logo designed by Jeremy Hildebrand (Ottawa, ON). The United States will be represented by Dave Wiegand (Portland, OR), Chris Cree (Dallas, TX), Brian Bowman (Villa Hills, KY), Marty Gabriel (Charleston, IL), Sam Kantimathi (Sacramento, CA), Jerry Lerman (Foster City, CA) and Bradley Whitmarsh (Attleboro, MA); Canada by Adam Logan (Ottawa, ON), Eric Tran (Calgary, AB), Ron Hoekstra (Vancouver, BC), Tony Leah (Toronto, ON), Robin Pollock Daniel (Toronto, ON), Dean Saldanha (Richmond, BC) and Sinna Vijayakumar (Mississauga, ON).

The 9th Can-Am SCRABBLE Challenge takes place on March 19-20 in Calgary, AB. Directed by club directors Siri Tillekeratne and Betty Bergeron, this invitational event features the top seven players from each country vying for possession of a newly enlarged Challenge Trophy. The U.S. leads Canada 5-2 in the history of the event, and has a 1911-1885 edge in average team rating as this issue goes to press.

## CNSC 20II Is On

I am delighted to be able to announce on behalf of event sponsor Hasbro Canada that the 2011 Canadian National SCRABBLE Championship (CNSC) will take place in Toronto on June 10-13 at the Bond Place Hotel at 65 Dundas Street East. Registration is open effective immediately, and instructions are available on NASPAWiki.

Although we are in a new venue again this year, most of the details are the same as at the last CNSC. The prize pool remains unchanged at $\$ 12,150$, and the new champion will receive $\$ 7,000$, possession of the trophy, and the right to represent Canada at this year's World SCRABBLE Championship. The defending three-time champion, Adam Logan (Ottawa, ON), qualifies to play in this invitational event, and 47 more places are available based on qualifying rating, with four more available through one qualifying tournament (QT) each in Eastern and Western Canada. The main event will consist of 18 rounds from Friday evening to Sunday afternoon, followed by a best-of-five finals on Monday. There will still be an open Early Bird on Friday, but just as a warmup, not a wildcard QT.

The event will feature live web coverage (as it has every year since its inception), and NASPA's website will include photos and commentary by Sherrie Saint John, and annotated Table 1 games. I will direct the championship, assisted by Mad Palazzo, though I still dream of playing in the championship again some day.

I'm also looking forward to our first time holding an event at the Bond Place Hotel. It's a newly renovated venue one block east of the "Heart of the City," Yonge-Dundas Square, in an exciting downtown neighbourhood full of shopping, dining and entertainment, while easily accessible by car or public transit. Kristen and I have been enjoying researching restaurant recommendations for players.

The Bond Place Hotel will also host Tony Leah's Toronto International SCRABBLE Open later this year in September, when 100 human and computer CSW players from around the world join the annual Michael Wise Memorial Tournament for a global SCRABBLE celebration.
